

# The Regina Beanie

*This easy worsted weight beanie is a perfect unisex capsule accessory for the cooler months. It will quickly become a staple of anyone you gift it to, including yourself! The 1x1 ribbing of the body gives a bit of texture, but is streamlined enough to showcase all kinds of yarns, including variegated and stripes! Top it off with a pom-pom, add rows for slouch, play around with yarn scraps, or work it stitch by stitch. The possibilities are endless!*

## Materials

- 4 mm / 6 US circular needles on 16" cord
- 5 mm / 8 US circular needles on 16" cord
- 5 mm / 8 US DPNs (optional)
- Yarn Needle
- 150-175 yards of worsted weight yarn  
*Sample uses one skein of Lorna's Laces Shephard Worsted (100% superwash merino wool; 4 ounces/115g = 225 yards/205 m)*

## Finished Measurements

18 inches/40 cm around x 11 inches /28 cm long

## Gauge

22 stitches x 20 rows in 2x2 rib on size 6 needles.

20 sts by 19 rows in 1x1 rib on size 7 needles

## Abbreviations

Knit- K

Purl- P

Knit Two Together- K2Tog

## Pattern

### RIBBED BRIM

*With size 6 needles, cast on 96 stitches.*

Place marker, be careful not to twist stitches for working in the round.

(K2, P2) until end of round. Continue working in k2, p2 until ribbing band reaches 4"/10cm in length. Row count should be approximately 20 rows.

## BODY

Switch to size 8 needles

**Round 1-30:** (K1, P1) until end of round - 96 stitches

*\*Note: Body of hat should be approximately 6 inches / 15 cm long at the end of round 30. If longer hat is desired, continue working in k1, p1 pattern stitch until desired length is reached.*

## CROWN DECREASE

Continue with size 8 needles, switch from circulars to DPNs when necessary or continue to work on circulars using magic ring technique.

**Round 1:** Remove marker, slip over 1 stitch, place marker, \*[(p1, k1) seven times, p1, k2tog] repeat from \* 5 times - 90 stitches

**Round 2:** [(P1, k1) seven times, k2tog] 5 times - 84 stitches.

**Round 3:** [(P1, k1) six times, p1, k2tog] 5 times - 78 stitches.

**Round 4:** [(P1, k1) six times, k2tog] 5 times - 72 stitches.

**Round 5:** [(P1, k1) five times, p1, k2tog] 5 times - 66 stitches.

**Round 6:** [(P1, k1) five times, k2tog] 5 times - 60 stitches.

**Round 7:** [(P1, k1) four times, p1, k2tog] 5 times - 54 stitches.

**Round 8:** [(P1, k1) four times, k2tog] 5 times - 48 stitches.

**Round 9:** [(P1, k1) three times, p1, k2tog] 5 times - 42 stitches.

**Round 10:** [(P1, k1) three times, k2tog] 5 times - 36 stitches.

**Round 11:** [(P1, k1) two times, p1, k2tog] 5 times - 30 stitches.

**Round 12:** [(P1, k1) two times, k2tog] 5 times - 24 stitches.

Leaving a 6-inch tail, cut yarn. With yarn needle, weave tail through remaining 24 stitches. Pull tail to completely close top of hat. Weave in remaining tail to secure.

## FINISHING

Block to finished shape if desired.

Weave in all ends.
